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## **Executive Summary**

During May-July 2013, the University of New Hampshire Survey Center conducted a survey for New Hampshire's nine Regional Planning Commissions, as part of the *Granite State Future* and *New Hampshire Broadband Mapping and Planning* initiatives. Funded in part by a grant from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development, *A Granite State Future* is intended to engage New Hampshire citizens in a public dialogue, at the local, regional and state levels, about what they want for the future of their communities and state. Results from the survey will inform updates to the Regional Master Plans in each of NH's nine planning regions. These regional plans, whose development has been required under State law (RSA 36:47) for over 40 years, are advisory documents designed to provide municipalities with data and strategies to support local decision-making as well as enhance regional cooperation.

With support from the National Telecommunications Information Administration of the US Department of Commerce and in conjunction with the University of New Hampshire and other partners, the New Hampshire Broadband Mapping and Planning Program (NHBMPP) is a comprehensive, multi-year effort that seeks to understand where broadband is currently available in NH, how it can be made more widely available in the future, and how to encourage increased levels of broadband adoption and usage. Results from the survey will inform the broadband plans developed in each of NH's nine planning regions.

The specific areas of interest are New Hampshire resident's opinions on a range of issues facing communities around the State – transportation and broadband infrastructure, housing, economic development, natural resource management, energy and natural hazard mitigation. A survey of two thousand nine hundred and thirty-five (2,935) New Hampshire adults was conducted by telephone between May 9 and July 21, 2013. The response rate was 33% and the margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.2%. (See Technical Report for a more detailed description of survey methods.) The following figures display survey results, detailed tabular results can be found in Appendix A, Appendix B contains the open-ended responses and Appendix C contains the survey instrument.

The intent of this report is to provide NH's regional planning commissions and other interested parties with a broad overview of the data collected. This report should serve as a concrete focus for engaging with these data and using them to design and implement strategies for regional planning. However, every summary statement made in this report will generate numerous questions from the reader about how this data element or piece of information applies to other specific strata of the population or planning domain. Many of these questions can readily be answered by the extensive cross tabulations that are provided for each survey question in Appendix A of this report. Some of the questions that will be generated by this report will require more extensive and sophisticated analyses of these data. Knowing this, it is our hope that New Hampshire Planning leaders will share these data with other academics and community organizations that will actively use these data to help New Hampshire discover more about their local population and about how better to target planning initiatives to meet the needs of those in specific communities.

Each section begins with a summary narrative that is written in the form of short, bulleted sentences that describe selected indicators on the data tables and charts. These narratives are not intended to explain or summarize every indicator in the accompanying data tables. This section was not meant to provide the reader with any conclusions.

It was intended to spark interest in the data and invite you to ask questions of this information and use the data cross tabs accompanying this report to understand better the planning concepts you are concerned about.

The charts and tables that follow display major findings of the survey. They are not intended to exhaustively present all the data in the survey. If no demographic differences were listed then responses were consistent across demographic categories. Not all findings are noted in this report; these are the highlights of the results. Additional results can be found in the detailed tables located in Appendix A.

## **Key Findings**

- Responses from residents of the Nashua Region were largely similar to those of statewide residents. The biggest difference involved what type of neighborhood residents live in (more Nashua residents live in developments away from the town center and less live in rural locations away from the town center).
- Residents believe that energy efficiency and energy choices should be the top priority for investing public dollars. Residents are largely in favor of all the proposed energy efficiency and renewable energy projects, except for the idea of having public charging stations made for electric vehicles.
- Residents view environmental protection and natural resource protection as the second most important priority for investing public dollars, and a majority believes that all environmental protection measures mentioned should be high priorities for policymakers, except for managing shore land and waterfront development.
- Safe and affordable housing is another important priority for investing public dollars. The development of single family housing and assisted living facilities were particularly favorable to residents while development of manufactured housing and apartments were the least favorable.
- Residents say that the top activity that their community should actively encourage is promoting local agriculture (88%). Majorities want to encourage many other activities as well, including expanding or promoting current businesses (84%) and promoting safe places to walk or bike (83%).
- Residents view quality schools as the most important thing to have in their community (94%). Other important aspects of a community include having small businesses and retail stores (86%), grocery stores (86%), nearby job opportunities (85%), and medical offices (83%).
- Residents view maintaining our bridges and highways to be the most important priority for transportation funding (71%). Residents were split on funding for other transportation initiatives, with a narrow majority favoring funding for expanding bus or rail service for commuting between major cities (62%), the availability of senior and special needs transportation (52%), and the availability of bike paths (52%).
- The vast majority of residents (96%) have internet access at home, and almost all of them (90%) consider their internet access adequate for their uses. Almost as many (83%) would not be willing to pay any additional money in exchange for faster internet speeds.



## Housing

A plurality of residents (38%) describe where they live as either a neighborhood close to the town center or a development away from the town center, followed by those in a rural location away from the town center (16%) and those downtown or in a town center (8%).

- Residents of the Nashua region are *more likely* to live in <u>a development away from the town center</u> than statewide residents. They are also *less likely* to live in <u>a rural location away from the town center</u>.
- Households earning less than \$60,000, non-white residents and those with a high school education or less are *more likely* to live <u>downtown or in the town center</u>.



#### Figure 1: How would you classify the neighborhood where you live? (q1)


When asked whether they would prefer to live in a small house but have a short commute to work or a large home with a longer commute, a majority (55%) said they would prefer the small home and short commute, 43% would prefer the large home and long commute and 2% did not know (Figure 2).

Meanwhile, almost two-thirds of residents (64%) would prefer to live in a strictly residential neighborhood while 35% would prefer a mixed residential/commercial neighborhood and 1% did not know (Figure 3).

- Households with two or more children, households earning more than \$160,000, those aged 40-49 and the self-employed are *more likely* to want a <u>larger home with a longer commute</u>.
- Older adults (70 and older), retired people, non-white residents and households earning less than \$60,000 are *more likely* to choose a <u>smaller home with a shorter commute</u>.
- Households earning less than \$40,000, non-white residents and those with a high school education or less are *more likely* to want to live in a <u>mixed residential/commercial neighborhood</u>.

Three in four residents (76%) who answered that they would like to live in a neighborhood with a mix of residences and businesses would prefer a smaller house with a short commute. A small majority (56%) of those who chose a residential neighborhood where you have to drive to services also prefer a larger house with a longer commute.



## **Transportation**

Seven in ten (71%) residents think that policy makers should invest more money in maintaining roads, highways and bridges (with 48% willing to pay more in taxes to do so), followed by expanding bus or rail service between major cities (62%), improving availability of senior and special needs transportation (52%), improving availability of bike paths (52%), improving the availability of public transportation (43%), reducing congestion on major roads (42%), sidewalks and crosswalk areas (41%) and traffic safety (34%).

- Residents of the Nashua Region are *more likely* than statewide residents to want investment in <u>expanding</u> <u>bus or rail service for commuting between major cities</u>.
- Household with two or more children, households earning less than \$40,000 and those aged 30 to 39 are *more likely* to want investment in <u>sidewalks and crosswalk areas</u>.
- Households earning less than \$40,000 and non-white residents are *more likely* to want investment in <u>improving the availability to public transportation</u>.



## *Figure 4: Should Policy Makers Invest More Money in Transportation (q2)*



## **Community Development**

A large majority of residents (73%) favor using municipal funds to provide sewer lines to existing and potential development (although just 52% would be willing to pay more in taxes for it), followed by sewer lines (73%) and broadband access (47%).

• Young people (18 to 29), those not employed and not looking and non-white residents are *more likely* to favor using funds for <u>broadband access</u>.






Favors & Willing to Pay Higher Taxes Favors But Not Willing To Pay Higher Taxes Oppose Don't Know

Four in five residents (80%) think that their town should encourage single family detached housing, followed by assisted living facilities (72%), housing for adults over 55 (65%), clusters of single family homes (62%), townhouses (60%), accessory apartments (58%), attached homes (49%), housing in areas with a business/residential mix (45%), apartment buildings (42%), and manufactured housing (36%).


- Older people (50 to 59 and 70 or older) and those with a high school education or less are *more likely* to want their town to encourage housing for adults over 55 years old.
- Households earning less than \$40,000, non-white residents and those with a high school education or less are *more likely* to want their town to encourage <u>apartment buildings</u>.

Nearly all (94%) residents find it important (85% "very important" and 9% "somewhat important") that there are quality schools in their community, followed by small businesses and retail stores (86%), grocery stores (86%), having nearby job opportunities (85%), medical offices (83%), cultural recreation facilities (81%), farms, farm stands and forestry businesses (80%), restaurants (67%) and that many places they want to go are within walking distance (44%).

- Older people (60 and older), households earning less than \$40,000, those with a high school education or less and non-white residents are *more likely* to think it is very important to have <u>medical offices</u>.
- Older people (70 and older), retired people, and households earning less than \$40,000 are *more likely* to think that <u>grocery stores</u> are very important.
- Young people (18 to 29) and households earning between \$20,000 and \$39,999 are *more likely* to think <u>nearby job opportunities</u> are very important.
- Those with technical school or some college education, the self-employed and households earning less than \$20,000 or between \$40,000 and \$59,999 are *more likely* to think that <u>farms, farm stands and forestry</u> <u>businesses</u> are very important.




## *Figure 7: How Important Is It To Have In Your Community? (q3)*


Only 10% of respondents find housing to be very affordable in their town, 60% find it somewhat affordable, 22% find it not very affordable, 4% find it not affordable at all and 4% don't know. When it comes to renting, only 6% find it very affordable, 40% find it somewhat affordable, 20% find it not very affordable, 6% find it not affordable at all and 29% don't know.

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• Young people (18 to 29), those with a high school education of less, non-white residents and households earning between \$40,000 and \$160,000 are *more likely* to think that <u>rent is somewhat affordable</u>.



#### Figure 8: How Affordable is Housing in Your Town? (q4 & q5)





Two-thirds (68%) of residents think that future development should occur in areas that are already developed while only 23% support development in undeveloped areas and 9% did not know.

 Young people (18 to 29) and those with technical school or some college education are *more likely* to <u>support growth in developed areas</u>. Those with a high school education or less and those who have lived in NH for five years or less are *more likely* to support growth in undeveloped areas.




#### Figure 9: Where should future development occur in your part of the state? (q8)

## **Environmental Protection**

Nearly all residents (95%) view protecting water quality for drinking as a high priority for their community, followed by protecting air quality (84%), preserving farms and agricultural land (77%), protecting water quality for recreational purposes like swimming and fishing (72%), protecting aquatic and marine habitats (68%), protecting access to recreation land and scenic views (61%), protecting forests for timber production (55%), and managing shore land and waterfront development (49%).

- Older people (70 or older), retired people, those with a high school education or less and those who have lived in NH for 6 to 10 years are more likely to think <u>protecting water for recreational use</u> is a high priority.
- Those aged 50 to 69 and those who work at home are *more likely* to think <u>protecting aquatic and marine</u> <u>habitats</u> is a high priority.
- Those aged 30 to 39 or 60 to 69, households earning less than \$40,000, and those who have lived in NH for 5 years or less are *more likely* to think <u>protecting access to recreational land and scenic views</u> is a high priority.
- Those who are not employed, those aged 30 to 39 or 70 or older, and those with a high school education or less are *more likely* to think <u>protecting forests for timber production</u> is a high priority.
- Older people (60 or older) and retired people are *more likely* to think <u>managing shore land and waterfront</u> <u>development</u> is a high priority.




## Figure 10: Priority Placed on These Community Issues (q9)

A large majority of residents (88%) say that promoting local agriculture should be actively encouraged in the community, followed by expanding or promoting current businesses (84%), promoting safe places to walk or bike (83%), protecting historic buildings & neighborhoods (78%), attracting more non-polluting light industry (76%), increasing access to forests and trails (75%), promoting other recreational activities (73%), increasing access to ponds, lakes and rivers (70%), sponsoring special cultural or sporting events (68%), expanding recreational fields (59%), attracting more stores and shops (52%) and promoting tourism (46%).

- Households earning less than \$40,000, those aged 60 to 69, non-white residents and part-time employees are *more likely* to say their community should actively encourage <u>promoting tourism</u>.
- Households with children and households earning between \$90,000 and \$160,000 and non-white residents are *more likely* to say their community should actively encourage <u>expanding recreational fields</u>.
- Young people (18 to 29), households earning less than \$40,000 and those who have been residents of NH for 10 years or less are *more likely* to say their community should <u>attract more stores</u>.

## **Energy Policies**


Nearly four in five residents (78%) support expanding incentives for home energy efficiency improvements (with 50% who "strongly support"), followed by higher energy efficiency standards in new buildings (76%), and promoting renewable energy sources such as solar, wind and geothermal (73%). Meanwhile only 34% were in support of public charging stations for electric vehicles.

- Older people (60 or older), those with a high school education or less and those not employed and not looking are *more likely* to strongly support <u>higher energy efficiency standards in new buildings</u>.
- Those with a high school education or less, households earning less than \$40,000, non-white residents, those who have lived in NH for 5 years or less, and those who are not employed or self-employed are *more* likely to strongly support <u>public charging stations for electric vehicles</u>.
- Those with some college education or less, households earning less than \$40,000, non-white residents and those who are not employed or self-employed are *more likely* to strongly support <u>promoting renewable</u> <u>energy sources</u>.

Almost half of residents (47%) think that local governments should be very involved in guidelines for renewable energy (such as large wind farms), 40% think they should be somewhat involved, 6% think they should be not very involved, 5% think they should be not at all involved and 2% don't know.

## **Emergency Preparedness**

A large majority of residents (78%) are concerned (39% "very concerned" and 39% "somewhat concerned") with power outages in their community followed by snow or ice storms (78%), wind damage (56%), flooding (38%), drought (38%) and wildfires (31%).

- Younger people (18 to 39) are more likely to be very concerned about snow or ice storms.
- Older people (70 and older) are more likely to be very concerned about flooding, droughts and wildfires.





Figure 14: How Concerned Are You About Weather Related Events In Your Community? (q14)

Only 14% of residents are very concerned about their community's level of preparedness in weather-related situations, while 36% are somewhat concerned, 31% are not very concerned, 18% are not at all concerned and 1% don't know.




## Figure 15: Concerned about Your Community's Level of Preparedness? (q15)

## **Priorities for Investing Public Dollars**

Residents' top priority for investing public dollars is environmental protection (22%), followed by energy efficiency (18%), safe and affordable housing (15%), economic development (14%), transportation system (10%), infrastructure for development (8%), preparedness for weather-related or other emergencies (5%), all priorities are equal (6%), and something else (2%).

When the top two responses are combined energy efficiency (40%) and environmental protection (39%) are the two most cited priorities.




#### Figure 16: Priorities for Investing Public Dollars (q17)


## **Broadband**

Nearly all (96%) residents have internet access in their home, while just 4% do not **(Figure 11).** For those who do not have internet access at home, a plurality (32%) says that they don't have it because it is too expensive, followed by they don't need it (25%), they have access at another place like their job (20%), they don't have an adequate computer (12%), and they don't know how to use it (2%). There were also 9% who cited another reason **(Figure 12).** 

- Those who are 70 or older, those with a high school education or less and households earning less than \$20,000 are *less likely* to have internet access at home.
- There were 5% of statewide respondents who said the most important reason why they didn't have access was because it is not available where they live. No Nashua region resident chose this response.








#### Figure 18: Most important reason why you don't have internet access at home?

Seven in ten residents (70%) have a cable internet connection, followed by those with DSL (19%), fixed wireless (3%), fiber (3%), cellular (1%), satellite (1%), and dialup (1%). There were also less than 1% who said they have had another type of connection and 3% didn't know.


• Households earning less than \$60,000 and those with a high school education or less are *less likely* to have <u>cable internet</u>.



#### Figure 19: What type of internet connection do you have at home?


For those who do have a dialup or satellite connection, most (63%) say that they don't know why, followed by it being too costly to change (24%), it being the only option available (8%), and the learning curve being too steep (2%). There were also 2% who said that they had another reason.

- Nashua region residents were *more likely* to say that <u>it is too costly to change</u> from dialup or satellite or they <u>did not know why they had it</u>.
- There were 2% of statewide residents that said it was <u>too much effort to change</u> or they <u>don't know other</u> <u>options</u>. There were no Nashua residents to choose either response.

For those who don't have satellite or dialup, a plurality (39%) of residents say that they have their current internet provider because it is the only option available, followed by being happy with their current provider (23%), it being too costly to change (7%), it being too much effort to change (3%), and they don't know what other options are available (2%). There were also 19% who had another reason and 6% who didn't know.




#### Figure 21: Why Are You Using Your Current Provider?

Only 3% of residents say that their monthly internet bill is less than \$20, while 23% pay \$20-49 per month, 28% pay \$50-99 per month, 26% pay \$100 or more per month and 19% did not know.

• Older people (60 and older) are more likely to pay \$100 or more per month.




#### Figure 22: What is your monthly internet bill?

More than three-quarters (78%) currently pay for a bundled internet service, 20% don't have a bundled service and 2% did not know.


• Households earning between \$20,000 and \$59,999 are less likely to pay for bundled service.

Almost all (88%) residents use their home internet to check email and their connection is adequate to do so, 76% shop online with an adequate connection, 45% watch online videos and have an adequate connection and 32% use VPN and have an adequate connection to do so.

- Older people (70 or older), those with some college education or less, the retired and the unemployed are *less likely* to <u>shop online</u>.
- Older people (50 or older) and those who are retired are *less likely* to <u>watch on-line video</u>. Conversely, younger people (18 to 39) are *more likely* to watch on-line video.
- Households earning more than \$160,000 are *more likely* to <u>use a VPN at home</u>. Older people (70 or older) are *less likely* to use a VPN.




#### Figure 24: What Do You Use The Internet At Home For



not adequate and 1% don't know (Figure 19). A large majority (83%) of residents would not be willing to pay more for faster internet speeds; 14% would be willing to pay 25% more per month, 1% would be willing to pay 50% more per month and 3% don't know (Figure 20).

## **Technical Report**

#### How the Sample Was Selected

The New Hampshire Regional Planning Commissions A Granite State Future (GSF) Survey was a telephone survey of randomly selected adults in the state of New Hampshire. This survey was conducted using a procedure called Random Digit Dialing (RDD), of both landline and cellular telephone.

A sample of households in the area was selected by a procedure known as <u>random digit dialing</u>. The way this works is as follows. First, with the aid of a computer, one of the three digit telephone exchanges that are currently used in the state (e.g., 772) is randomly selected. The computer then randomly selects one of the "working blocks"--- the first two of the last four numbers in a telephone number (e.g., 64)--and attaches it to the randomly selected exchange. Finally, the computer program then generates a two digit random number between 00 and 99 (e.g., 57) which is attached to the previously selected prefix (772), and the previously selected working block (64) resulting in a complete telephone number, i.e., 772 6457. This procedure is then repeated numerous times by the computer to generate more random numbers, so that we have a sufficient quantity to conduct the survey. The end result is that each household in the area in which there is a telephone has an equally likely chance of being selected into the sample. This procedures is done for both land line and cellular exchanges.

The random sample used in the GSF survey was purchased from Scientific Telephone Samples (STS), Foothill Ranch, CA. STS screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

Each of these randomly generated telephone numbers is called by one of our interviewers from a centrally supervised facility at the UNH Survey Center. If the number called is found not to be a residential one, it is discarded and another random number is called. (Approximately forty-five percent of the numbers were discarded because they are found to be businesses, institutions, or not assigned.) If it is a residential number, the interviewer then randomly selects a member of the household by asking to speak with the adult currently living in the household who has had the most recent birthday. This selection process ensures that every adult (18 years of age or older) in the household has an equally likely chance of being included in the survey. No substitutions are allowed. If, for example, the randomly selected adult is not at home when the household is first contacted, the interviewer cannot substitute by selecting someone else who just happens to be there at the time. Instead, he or she must make an appointment to call back when the randomly selected adult is at home. In this way, respondent selection bias is minimized.

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#### When the Interviewing Was Done

New Hampshire adults in the GSF survey were interviewed between May 9 and July 6, 2013. Each selected respondent was called by a professional UNH Survey Center interviewer from a centrally supervised facility at the UNH Survey Center. Telephone calls during the field period were made between 9:00 AM and 9:00 PM.

#### Response Rates

Interviews were completed with 2,935 randomly selected adults in New Hampshire from a sample of 25,114 randomly selected telephone numbers. Using American Association for Public Opinion (AAPOR) Response Rate 4, the response rate for the Granite State Future survey was 33% percent. The formula to calculate standard AAPOR response rate is:

$$\frac{I}{(I+P) + (R+NC+O) + e(UH+UO)}$$

I=Complete Interviews, P=Partial Interviews, R=Refusal and break off, NC=Non-Contact, O=Other, e=estimated portion of cases of unknown eligibility that are eligible, UH=Unknown household, UO=Unknown other.

#### Weighting of Data

The data have been weighted to account for known biases of telephone surveys. The data in the Granite State Future survey are weighted by the number of adults and telephone lines (landlines and cell phones) within households to equalize the chances that any one adult would be selected for inclusion. The data are also weighted by respondent sex, regional planning commission, and age of respondent.

#### Sampling Error

The Granite State Future survey, like all surveys, is subject to sampling error due to the fact that all residents in the area were not interviewed. For those questions asked of five hundred (500) or so respondents, the error is +/- 4.4%. For those questions where fewer than 500 persons responded, the sampling error can be calculated as follows:

Sampling Error = 
$$\pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{P(1-P)}{N}}$$

Where P is the percentage of responses in the answer category being evaluated and N is the total number of persons answering the particular question.

For example, suppose you had the following distribution of answers to the question, "Should the state spend more money on road repair even if that means higher taxes?" Assume 1,000 respondents answered the question as follows:

YES	47%
NO	48%
DON'T KNOW	5%

The sampling error for the "YES" percentage of 47% would be

$$\pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{47(53)}{1000}} = \pm 3.1\%$$

for the "NO" percentage of 48% it would be

$$\pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{48(52)}{1000}} = \pm 3.1\%$$

and for the "DON'T KNOW" percentage of 5% it would be

$$\pm 1.96 \sqrt{\frac{5(95)}{1000}} = \pm 1.4\%$$

In this case we would expect the true population figures to be within the following ranges:
